

1. INTRODUCTION

The Institute of Hotel Management Catering Technology and Applied Nutrition, Chennai was established in 1963 by Govt. of India at National Level jointly sponsored by Govt. of Tamil Nadu as one of the pioneer Institute in India for Imparting training in three-year Diploma Course in Hotel Management and Catering Technology and also various craft certificate courses in Hospitality Education. Three year B.Sc. Degree course in Hospitality and Hotel Administration is run by National Council for Hotel Management, New Delhi. National Council for Hotel Management has collaborated with Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi for B.Sc. Degree in Hospitality and Hotel Administration for the year 2023-2024. At present Capital Grant is funded by the Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India and Recurring Expenditure is self-managed by the Institute from the income resources of course fees etc. The Govt. of Tamil Nadu, is however, closely associated with the Institute since its very inception. 

7. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

SYSTEM OF ADMISSION:

(a) First year of 2-year M.Sc. Degree Course in Hospitality Administration under National Council for Hotel Management & Indira Gandhi National Open University.

From the academic year 2013-14 as per guidelines of Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India admission to First year of 2-year M.Sc. Degree Course in Hospitality Administration (Semester system) and selection of candidates has been done by National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Noida on all India basis for all IHMs. The Institute admits the candidates selected for IHM-Chennai by National Council for Hotel Management, Noida.

National Council for Hotel Management & Catering Technology, Noida and Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi have been conducting the Examination and awarding Degrees for the above courses from 2023-2024.

(b) <u>First year of 3-year B.Sc. Degree course in Hospitality & Hotel Administration under National</u> Council for Hotel Management & Jawaharlal Nehru University.

From the academic year 1983-84 as per guidelines of Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India admission to First year of 3-year Diploma course in Hotel Management and Catering Technology has been made by the Joint Admission Committee of the National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Noida on All India basis for all the Institutes of Hotel Management and Catering Technology in India including IHM Chennai.

Common syllabus for Diploma course in Hotel Management and Catering Technology on All India basis has been introduced from 1984-85 in all the INSTITUTE OF HOTEL MANAGEMENT coming under National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Noida which was revised in 1996-97. The above 3-Year Diploma Course has been upgraded to 3-Years Bachelor's Degree in Hospitality & Hotel Administration from the academic year 2002-2003 by NCHM in collaboration with IGNOU, New Delhi up to 2022-2023. The above course from the academic year 2023-2024 onwards is run by National Council for Hotel Management collaborating with Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi.

National council for Hotel Management & Catering Technology, Noida and Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi has been conducting the Examinations and awarding Degrees for the above course.

Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) followed by Centralized counseling has been introduced and conducted by NCHM., Noida from the academic year 2002-2003.

Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) followed by Decentralized counseling at the selected IHMs has been introduced from the academic year 2009-10 since then IHM, Chennai has been serving as one of the centers for on-line counseling for admission.

NCHMCT has introduced Semester System for 3-Year B.Sc. in Hospitality and Hotel Administration from the year 2009-10.

For the Academic Year 2023-24, common advertisement was released by the National Council for Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India, Noida and Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi in leading dailies in January 2023 inviting applications for JEE-2023 for admission to first year of 3-year B.Sc Degree Course in Hospitality & Hotel Administration from the Indian Nationals for 78 NCHM affiliated Institutes of Hotel Management, fixing the last date for receipt of filled in application as 02.05.2023.

Eligibility to apply for Degree course being that a candidate should secure a pass in +2 or equivalent examination in any stream with English as compulsory subject. There is no age restriction for appearing in NCHM JEE as per the New Education Policy. 15% seats reserved for SC, 7.5% seats for ST, 27% for the category other Backward Classes belonging to the "Non Creamy Layer" (OBC-NCL) and 10% for Economically Weaker Section (EWS). Each category will have 5% reservation for Persons with Disabilities (PWD) as defined in the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 (RPWD Act 2016) and one seat (Supernumerary) is provided for Registered Kashmiri Migrants.

The Entrance Examination was conducted on 14.05.2023 by National Testing Agency, New Delhi throughout India with centres at Chennai, Trichy, Madurai, Hyderabad, Bangalore and Thiruvananthapuram for the Southern Region. The candidates who came out successful in the Entrance Examination Test on all India merit have been called for online Counselling at 17 centres all over India for all the 78 institutes including Chennai during 16.06.2023 to 25.07.2023.

Necessary nomination of seats viz. 5 for Lakshadweep and 10 for Andaman & Nicobar as per government instructions, has been provided.



(c) OTHER CRAFT/DIPLOMA/PGD COURSES AFFILIATED TO NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR HOTEL MANAGEMENT, NOIDA.

The admission notification, in respect of the other courses under S.No. 3 to 11 for the academic year 2023-2024 was released by the Institute on 07.05.2023 in Dinakaran and also uploaded in the Institute's website, inviting applications from eligible candidates fulfilling the criteria, fixing the last date as 15.07.2023. Admission is being granted based on merit in the qualifying examination.

As decided by the Board of Governors in their meeting held on 25.10.2005, if the intake is less than 50%, those courses need not be conducted. Accordingly, as the response was poor/intake was less than 50%, these courses could not be conducted during the year 2023-2024 – viz. Post Graduate Diploma in Accommodation Operation & Management, Post Graduate Diploma in Dietetics and Hospital Food Service, Diploma in Food and Beverage Service, Diploma in Housekeeping Operation, Diploma in Front Office Operation.

Semester system has been introduced also for the Craftsmanship Course in Food Production from the academic year 2010-11.



(b) <u>TRAINING PROGRAMMES UNDER CAPACITY BUILDING FOR SERVICE PROVIDERS OF</u> MINISTRY OF TOURISM, GOVT. OF INDIA.

Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India is sponsoring the following training programmes under CBSP:

6 days Skill Testing and Certification Programme

Professionals who are practicing their respective jobs as Cooks/Waiters etc. without a proper certification, are provided an opportunity to earn a certificate from the Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India by attending 6 days orientation programme in the Institute where the candidate is provided with a meal and stipend of Rs.300/- per day or Rs.1800/- for 6 days to compensate wage loss (Monday to Saturday). 5 days orientation classes will be conducted and on the 6th day skill testing will be done by external experts and certificate signed by Principal is given. This recognition would help such experienced service providers in finding mobility with their trade.

Hospitality Training Programme (Hunar Se Rozgaar):

Hospitality Training Programme in Multi Cuisine Cook (11 weeks/63 working days) F & B Service – Steward and Room Attendant (6 weeks/36 working days) Front Office Associate (7 Weeks/43 working day) are conducted for candidates with at least a Pass in 8th std. who are between the age of 18 and above. This programme is conducted from Monday to Friday from 1 pm to 8 pm. While there is no course fee, students would be paid a stipend of Rs. 2,000/- for Multi Cuisine Cook and Rs.1500/- for Room Attendant / Front Office Associate Courses with a meal, uniform and kitchen kit. Upon attaining minimum 90% attendance and upon successful completion of the course, a test would be conducted at the end of the course and certificate is given signed by Head of Department & Principal. These candidates are trained to provide man power to the skilled level in the Hospitality Industry. The Institute assists the candidates in placement.



14. MEASURES TAKEN/SYSTEM IN PLACE TO PREVENT RAGGING

As per instructions of Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India and State Govt. orders, the institute has taken following measures to prevent ragging and maintain discipline in and around the campus:

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the standalone financial statements of M/s. Institute of Hotel Management Catering Technology and Applied Nutrition, Chennai ("The Society"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2024 and the statement of Income and Expenditure for the year then ended and notes to the financial statements including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the entity as at March 31st, 2024 and its income and expenditure for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

The following critical points were observed and to be complied with:

- 1. Note No.3.3.2 of the financial statements contains the details of retirement liabilities, pension liabilities and other related liabilities. The Entity follows cash basis for accounting for these Retirement related liabilities. Hence provision for these liabilities and the related cost is not recognized in the books of accounts which results in non compliance of Accounting Standard 15 and will impact the surplus. We are unable to quantify the amount in the absence of adequate information and non availability of expenditure workings.
- 2. Non-adherence to the accounting treatment and presentation in the financial statements as prescribed in Accounting Standard 12 Accounting for Government Grants. This will not have any impact on the Excess of Income over Expenditure for the year.

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As a result of these matters, we were unable to determine whether any accounting changes might have been found necessary in respect of the elements making up the Balance Sheet and statement of Profit and Loss.

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by ICAI. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the entity in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by ICAI and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

Emphasis of Matter

We draw attention to the following: Based on information and explanations received, with respect to the Endowment/Earmarked Funds - Government of India Grant - Building Account contains an amount of Rs. 60,55,596/-, Government of India Grants - Equipments/Furniture Rs.13,10,647/- As per explanations received these are carried over for a long period. Status of these balances is to be obtained and to be reconciled.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of these matters.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs and results of operations of the entity in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in India. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material

misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so. Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the entity's financial reporting process.

- 5.5. Tuition Fees received are shown net of refunds to discontinued students.
- 5.6. Other fees received are shown net of expenses and refund to discontinued students.

6. GOVERNMENT GRANTS/SUBSIDIES

- 6.1. Government grants received for Earmarked projects are shown separately under Earmarked Funds in the Balance Sheet and as and when it is utilized transferred to the Capital Fund Account. The Assets created are shown separately in the Fixed Asset Schedule.
- 6.2. Grants relating to Fixed Assets purchased out of Govt. of India Grant-in-Aid are adjusted against depreciation of such asset and hence the grant fund is adjusted over the life of the asset.
- 6.3. Government grant/subsidy are accounted on realization basis.

7. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

Gratuity on death/retirement of employees, leave encashment and pension are accounted on cash basis.
